Dear Families,

t's hard to believe that this month brings the end of the third weeks! Your children are growing and learning so much!

In reading and writing, we are diving deeper into non-fiction texts. Students are strengthening their understanding of expository text and its purpose while making connections to their experiences, other texts and the larger community. Readers are continuing to identify the topic and details, make predictions, retell facts, and discuss ways authors group information. Students are also exploring and identifying different forms of media (commercials, newspapers, radio programs) that impact the meaning of information. The book fair is a great example of how media literacy is around in schools. Writers are digging deeper into dictating and writing information through lists, captions, and invitations.

In math, we are starting to develop number concepts to 20. We have really solidified our work with understanding numbers to 10 so now we are going to move on to numbers 11-20. Understanding that these numbers consist of 10 and "some more." We are going to be able to read, write, represent, compare, and manipulate these quantities. Students will also be spiraling previously learned tasks in math to help review those skills.

In science, we are classifying objects around them as living or nonliving. The students are expected to examine evidence that living organisms have basic needs such as food, water, and shelter for animals and air, water, nutrients, sunlight, and space or plants.

n social studies, we are learning about how technology impacts our lives and community. Students are comparing current technology used at home and at school and how it may be different from what people used long ago. Students are identifying how those differences impacts a community.

In social emotional learning we are talking about managing anger and disappointment. We will also discuss this month handling being knocked down and ways we can control these emotions and what we should do when we encounter these feeling.
